Dear Parents and Carers, Principal's Report

BUILDING WORKS

Preliminary works has begun to provide power and data to the new demountable classrooms which should be delivered in the next few weeks. The fencing which was installed throughout the playground today is to ensure our students are safe in the playground whilst this trenching work is undertaken. It is expected these fences will be removed in approximately two weeks once the trenching is completed and new cabling installed.

Access throughout the school will remain the same, though play areas may need to change depending upon the stage of the work.

SWIMMING

K-2 classes (except for 2S) completed their swimming lessons last Friday and class teachers were very happy with the progress students made over the two week program.

For some students, the focus was on building water confidence, that is, teaching children to feel safe entering the pool and developing basic water safety skills. For other students, skills included learning to dive and developing stroke skills in freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke. No matter the level at which they started all students developed new skills. Hopefully many parents will continue to provide swimming lessons for their children to build on the skills students have developed.

Students in Years 3-6, and class 2S, started swimming lessons yesterday and will continue for the next two weeks.

I thank parents for supporting the school's swimming program.

PEDESTRIAN CROSSING SUPERVISION

Please note there will be no crossing supervisor tomorrow at the Kent Road crossing (afternoon), or the Herring Road crossing (afternoon) and on Thursday morning .

I have been in discussion with the Department of Roads and Maritime (RMS) regarding the supervision of the pedestrian crossings in the absence of the crossing supervisor. RMS has advised there are currently no casual crossing supervisors available to fill in when our crossing supervisors are absent. Please be aware that, as advised by RMS staff, school staff are not authorised to carry out the duties of the School Crossing Supervisor.

I will advise parents via the school app when I receive notification from RMS that the crossing supervisor will be absent, and teachers will revise the procedures for safely crossing the road with their classes.

I also ask all parents to discuss these procedures with their children.

- Wherever possible, cross the road at a designated pedestrian crossing facility
- Stop! Look! Listen! Think! when crossing the road
- Take care whenever you cross
- Don't run across the road

Road safety

Walking together safely to and from school

Walking to school and back home again is a great way to spend time with your children and encourage safe and healthy behaviours.

Here are a few things you can do to help keep your children safer as a pedestrian:

- Talk with your children about being alert in the road environment.
- Plan and practice your trip to school so you use pedestrian crossings where possible.
- Always hold your child's hand. Children need your help to spot dangers such as vehicles coming out of driveways. They can also be easily distracted and wander into traffic.
- Meet your child near the school gate and don't call them from across the road.
- Explain why the place you have chosen is the safest place to cross.
- Remind your child to **STOP! LOOK! LISTEN! THINK!** every time they cross the road and keep checking until safely across.
- Talk to them about why they should stop, look, listen, think before crossing a driveway, road or carpark.

Young children can learn and practice these safe pedestrian behaviours with you. This will help them to be safer pedestrians when they are old enough to travel alone.

Mobiles, music and other distractions

Texting, talking or playing on the phone or other device, makes your child vulnerable when walking in the traffic environment.

Your child should put away all devices before they start their journey. Talk with them about how this helps limit distractions and keeps them alert to possible dangers. It is good practice to teach your child from a young age to always concentrate when walking in the traffic environment.
